

State Trivia

Board Game

Materials:

- game board (pages 2-3)
- state trivia cards (pages 4-7)
- 6-sided die
- markers (any small object)

Preparation Tips:

- Print the question cards on card

How to Play:

Begin by setting the markers on

Each player rolls the die to determine the starting square. The player with the highest number is Player 1. The player with the lowest number is Player 2.

Player 1 rolls the die and moves their marker the number of spaces indicated on the die. If the player lands on a square with a question, they must answer the question. If the player is correct, they move forward one space. If the player is incorrect, they move back one space.

Player 2 takes a question card and answers it. If Player 1 is correct, they move forward one space. If Player 1 is incorrect, they move back one space.

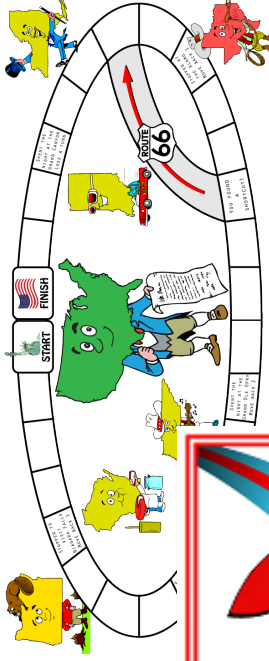
Then it is Player 2's turn to roll the die and move their marker.

Continue taking turns until one player reaches the finish line. The first player to reach the finish line wins.

Remember:

A player can only cross the "Route 66" shortcut once per game. If a player crosses the "Route 66" shortcut, they must answer a question. If they answer correctly, they can skip their next turn.

If a player lands on "Lose a turn," they skip their next turn.
