Latin Roots: A - O

Root words are parts of words that have meaning but are not usually words by themselves. They need affixes, other roots, or both to make a full word.

Many English words have roots that come from Greek or Latin. Recognizing root words can help you spell words correctly and guess the meaning of unknown words.

The table below lists some common Latin roots and their meanings.

Root	Meaning
<i>aud</i>	hear; sound
<i>bene</i>	good; well
<i>cap</i>	take; hold; head

Root	Meaning
<i>grac/grat</i>	thank; please
<i>grad/gred/gress</i>	go; step
<i>jac/ject</i>	throw; cast
