Adverbs

An adverb is a word that describes a verb.

An adverb tells **how**, **when**, or **where** the verb happens.

Many adverbs that tell how end with the letters *ly*.

example: Joan pained slowly. *Slowly* describes the action *painted*.

When you compare two actions, the adverb will often end with the letters *er* or *est*.

example: Birds fly higher than insects. *Higher* describes the verb *fly*.
Airplanes fly highest of all. *Highest* describes the action *fly*.
