The tiger is famous for its stripes. These stripes aren't just for looks, however. They help the cat blend in with the grasses and trees. This helps the tiger stalk prey on its nighttime hunts.

What do tigers eat? They hunt large animals like deer, water buffalo, wild pigs, and antelope. Tigers eat smaller animals, too, and even hunt leopards, bears, and young elephants and rhinos. When close enough, the cat rushes and leaps, biting the animal's neck or throat

with its powerful jaws. The tiger eats as much as it can and then either drags away the rest or covers it with dirt and grass. It returns over the next few days to eat more.



Sadly, the number of these amazing cats left in the wild continues to shrink. One hundred years ago, nine tiger subspecies and 100,000 tigers roamed rainforests, snow forests, evergreen forests, savannas, and
