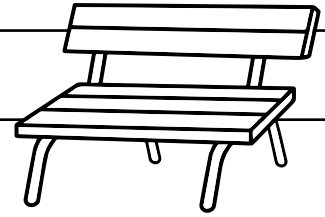


# Sit, Sat, and Set



The words **sit** and **set** sound very similar but have different meanings.

The verb **sit** means to be seated. The past tense of **sit** is **sat**.

examples: Simone and Jordan **sit** on the bench. (present tense)

Simone and Jordan **sat** on the bench. (past tense)

The verb **set** means to place something somewhere. The past tense of **set** is **set**.

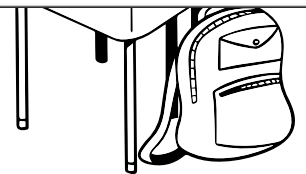
example: I **set** the book on the table. (can be present or past tense)

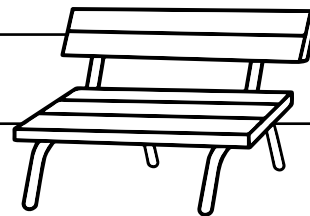
