One major factor determining storm strength is heat. As global temperatures climb, so does storm power. For example, warm air sucks up water more rapidly over hot oceans. This flow sends air rushing, turning a thunderstorm into a hurricane—an angry housecat into a roaring tiger.

Moisture is another factor. Changing global temperatures also change wind and evaporation patterns inland. This leads to increased flooding in some places but droughts elsewhere.
