



Dialogue tags tell who a speaker is. They may have other clauses that tell what a speaker is doing, but they *must* include a speaking verb such as *said*.

Action tags tell what a speaker is doing *without* including a speaking verb. Unlike dialogue tags, they are offset from dialogue with ending punctuation, not commas.


