be shy. *Koi* sounds the same as *coy*, but there is nothing coy about koi fish! Chances are you've seen these big, bright, colorful fish in ponds or on TV. They really stand out.

Koi look like big goldfish, but they aren't. Koi and goldfish are just cousins! They both belong to a fish family called carp. In fact, *koi* is like a nickname. Their full Japanese name is *nishikigoi* (NEE-shee-kee-GOY). It pretty much means *colorful carp* in English. Only special, brightly colored

Plain-colored carp started out in China. Then they came to Japan. They were mostly kept for food. Farmers and families kept the fish outside in ponds in case they needed more food during winter.

Sometime around the 1820s, Japanese families saw some carp were born with pretty patterns. That's when they began breeding the fish for patterns and colors. The koi was born!

Koi come in many colors. They

started off as red, white, yellow, black, or blue. Many bred koi are no longer a single color. Different colors and patterns all have their own names. More recently, people have bred metallic koi. They are shiny gold or silver.

There are also butterfly koi.

people think they are prettier.

American Koi Judges Association has many shows a year.

How much a koi costs depends on its size, color, and pattern. Plain baby koi might be \$20. Bigger, prettier koi might be \$3,000. Show-quality koi are often at least \$10,000. The most expensive koi ever sold was about \$1.8 million!

If you want a koi pond, you should know most live at least 50 years. One even lived to 226! They are also cold-water fish, though they prefer

water between 50–80°F (10–27°C). Make sure the water is at least 3 feet (1 meter) deep. Koi grow up to 3 feet (1 meter) long, and they need places to hide. Their eye-catching colors don't just catch human eyes. You don't want birds or foxes snatching them up.
