Participles

A participle is a verb form that is used as an adjective. There are two types of participles.

Present participles end in *-ing*.

example: The barking dog woke the baby.

Past participles usually end in *-ed*, but may also have other endings to indicate past tense. For example: *slept* and *eaten*

example: The dog tracked mud onto the freshly mopped floor.
